<b>Public Inquiry</b>	<b>Answer</b>
<p>Does the applicant need to have already been trained in the approved intervention?</p>	<p>No, DHS will provide training to all successful applicants on the chosen intervention after they have completed the GTO Training. Curriculum training is tentatively scheduled to take place during the months of October and November 2012 in the Metro Atlanta area.</p>
<p>Can the reference forms be updated so that text can be entered into all fields?</p>	<p>The reference forms have been updated. Please check the DHS/DFCS?PREP page to access updated forms</p>
<p>Is there a projected target for the number of youth to be reached by each awardee?</p>	<p>DHS has not set a minimum number of youth that potential applicants must serve as we recognize that some populations may be harder to reach than others. For this reason, the projected numbers of youth to be served should be determined by the applicant. This number should be based on what the applicant deems attainable</p>
<p>Is the RS+ curriculum required in addition to one of the other interventions?</p>	<p>Yes, In addition to implementing the sex education curriculum, ALL successful applicants will be required to implement the 6 core lessons of Relationship Smarts Plus. Form B outlines the minimum number of weeks needed to complete each approved program model.</p>
<p>If we are currently implementing one of the programs now, would it be beneficial for us to request funds for that program or a new program?</p>	<p>It would depend on the funding source of your existing program. State or federal funds cannot be used to supplant existing funding.</p>

Box number 3 – Public Entities and Private Community Based Organizations (CBOs)

QUESTION: Are incarcerated youth 10 – 17 an eligible population for CBOs applying for PREP funding?

This questions refers to the cycle in which you do your financial reporting (i.e. January-December or July-June)

Making Proud Choices was originally developed and evaluated with middle school students between the ages of 11-13. However, this curriculum can and has been effectively adapted for implementation with high school students.

While the Office of Adolescent Health (OAH) has identified 28 evidenced based curriculums, Successful applicants under this funding announcement are required to implement a curriculum from the given list.

Youth who are incarcerated are not an eligible population for PREP funding.

If the organization has never received federal funding and does not have a registered DUNS#, do they need to do so before applying? Or can they submit the application without a DUNS #?
